This letter is intended to inform Comal County that CGT U.S. Limited (CGT) is submitting Foreign Trade Zone (FTZ) sub-zone and manufacturing authority applications to the U.S. Department of Commerce FTZ Board in order to designate a new manufacturing site in New Braunfels as a FTZ subzone. The FTZ subzone will consist of a new 27.78 acres manufacturing facility in the New Braunfels industrial park. CGT has indicated in its FTZ subzone application that the project involves a capital investment of \$80 million and the creation of 200 new jobs.


As Grantee under FTZ #80, the City of San Antonio is required, under FTZ procedures, to certify all the taxing jurisdictions that will be affected by the designation. As you may know, the FTZ program provides key benefits of deferring, reducing and eliminating import tariffs or duties. To many companies, this is an important tool in economic development efforts, which can help stimulate investment, promote international trade and provide greater employment opportunities to residents.

In order to complete its sub-zone designation application, the FTZ Board requires Comal County's concurrence or non-objection to the application, which should be sent in writing from Comal County to:
