1. Entrance to St. Joseph's Cemetery, Comal (Wenzel Cemetery) looking NW.
2. Hand operated water pump and pedestrian gate looking NW.

8. Looking S, the last two rows of crosses are the graves of Mexican and Mexican Americans.
9. Looking NE toward Cemetery Crucifix located on East boundary of cemetery.
10. Looking SW from Crucifix; Southern part of cemetery.
11. Looking SW from Crucifix; Northern part of cemetery.
