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**Health director: Not too late to get your flu shot**

*NEW BRAUNFELS* — It's not too late for Comal County residents to get their flu shots, either from their doctors or from the county's Public Health Office, said Gwen Mills, Comal County public health director.

The flu vaccine takes about two weeks to be fully effective in a person's body, Mills said, and flu has yet to hit Comal County this winter – leaving time for residents to get vaccinated.

“We recommend all residents who are able to get their flu vaccine do so as soon as possible,” she said.

Flu shots are available by appointment at the Public Health Office, now located at 1297 Church Hill Drive in New Braunfels. Cost varies depending on insurance coverage. The office accepts Blue Cross Blue Shield, CHIP, Children's Medicaid, Medicare and cash. Call 830-221-1150 for more information.

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
