Tax Freeze Proposition

All Parties		
Providing that if a person is disabled or sixty-five (65) years of age or older receives a residence homestead exemption, then the total amount of ad valorem taxes imposed by Comal County, Texas shall not be increased while it remains the residence homestead of that person or that person's spouse who is disabled or sixty-five (65) years of age or older and receives a residence homestead exemption on the homestead. If a person who is disabled or is sixty-five (65) years of age or older dies in a year in which the person receives a residence homestead exemption then the total amount of ad valorem taxes imposed by Comal County, Texas may not be increased while it remains the residence homestead of that person's surviving spouse if the spouse is fifty-five (55) years of age or older at the time of the person's death.
